



<b>OPERATOR EXAMPLE</b>	<b>FINDS PAGES CONTAINING</b>
birth order	the words <b>birth</b> and <b>order</b>
“birth order”	the exact phrase “ <b>birth order</b> ”
violence <b>OR</b> aggression	either the word <b>violence</b> or the word <b>aggression</b>
virus -computer	the word <b>virus</b> but NOT the word <b>computer</b>
spider +internet	information about software NOT arachnids
~auto safety	synonyms for the word <b>auto</b> : <b>truck, vehicle, car</b> , etc.
site:	restricted to a specific domain (put in the search term first) Example: “west nile virus” site:cdc.gov Example: steroids site:.edu OR site:.gov
define:	definitions of a specified word from around the Web
copyright * violations	<b>copyright</b> and <b>violations</b> separated by one or more words Example: copyright law violations; Copyright Act Violations

<b>link:</b>	linked pages	link:www.wla.lib.wi.us/wapl/ (Find pages linked to WAPL’s Website)

<b>info:</b>	info about a page	info:www.stormfront.org (Example: “Racist discussion board for pro-White activists and anyone else interested in White survival.”)

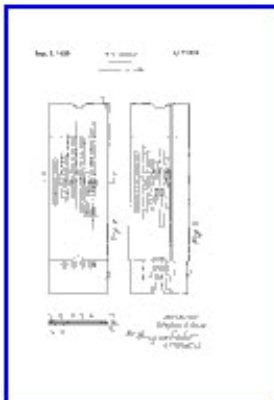

## Google Patents

Premiered in December 2006.

### Pros:

- Keyword searchable in entire patent history.
- You can search for words within patents.

### Cons:

- Details that are included vary from patent to patent depending upon what information is available.
- Not yet able to view or print full text patents.
- Doesn't currently include patent applications, international patents, or recent U.S. patents.

### Most Records Include:

Patent Summary – key citation information about the patent  
Claims – lists the specific claims made by the patent  
Drawings – displays thumbnail links of drawings in the body of the patent  
Citations – lists other patents cited by the patent  
Referenced by – links you to all the patents that reference the one you're viewing

### Interpreting your Google Books Search Results

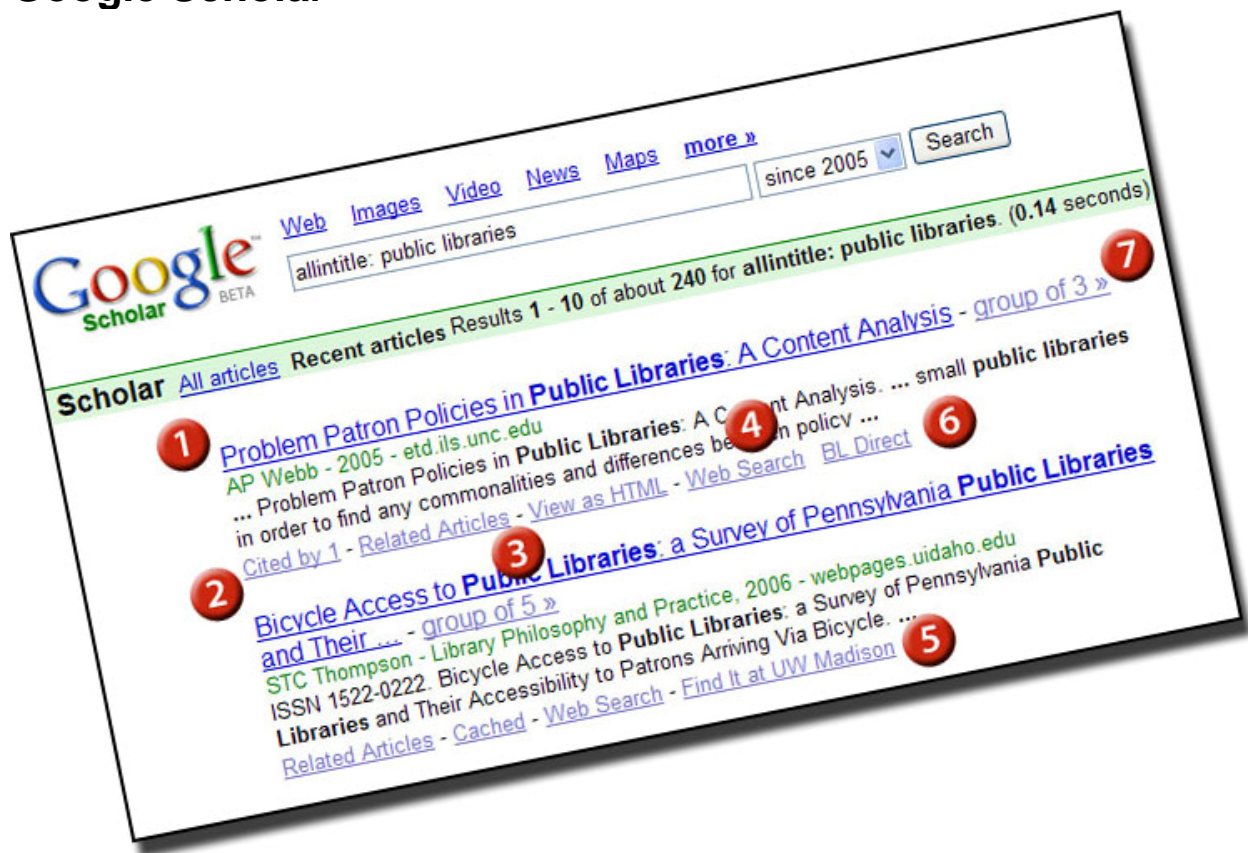
- Full View - digital version of entire book is available. Items are in the public domain (published before 1923), or author has given approval for access to the entire book
- Limited Preview – view a limited number of pages (access is determined by publisher). Usually the table of contents and/or index are included; sometimes whole chapters are available.
- Snippet View – view a few sentences around your search term
- No Preview Available – view basic citation information about the book

### Options

- Search in this book – allows the user to search within the book they have selected
- About this book – provides citation information (complete title, ISBN and subject headings)
- Find it in a Library – accesses WorldCat to search, by zip code, for libraries which own the item
- Buy the book – Click on one of the links to online booksellers to go directly to a page where you can buy the book

# Google Scholar



## Explanation of Links

1. **Title** – Links to the abstract of the article, or when available on the web, the complete article.
2. **Cited By** – Identifies other papers that have cited articles in the group.
3. **Related Articles** – Finds other papers that are similar to articles in this group.
4. **Web Search** – Searches for information about this work on Google.
5. **Library Links** – Locates libraries which have a physical copy of the work.
6. **BL Direct** – Purchase the full text of the article through the British Library. Recommend interlibrary loan to patrons, if available.
7. **Group of** – Finds other articles included in this group of scholarly works, possibly preliminary, which you may be able to access. Examples include preprints, abstracts, conference papers or other adaptations.

**Hints for Effective Searching:** Use Web “operators” (~ + - “ ”) to refine your search  
Limit search terms to “in the title of the article”  
Limit by date
