The purpose of this bibliography is to include core LGBTQ resources to aid in collection development and/or curriculum development. Given the magnitude of literature and the rapid appearance of new publications, this is by no means an exhaustive list of works. In particular, books other than reference titles and readers are not included. For the types of resources that are included, currency (1990-present) and suitability for academic library collections were two key selection criteria. Sources consulted for the compilation of this bibliography include WorldCat, *Magazines for Libraries*, *Ulrich's Periodical Directory*, *Choice*, well-known LGBT library collections and archives (especially Boston College Library - Liesel Tyson, Librarian; UC Berkeley for videos/dvds; UW-Madison, WS Librarian, Phyllis Holman Weisbard; University of Michigan Library), as well as articles, pathfinders, and guides found via the library literature or on the web.

DATABASES

Alternative Press Index & Archives (OCLC)

Comprehensive guide to alternative sources of information published from 1969-1990. Coverage is international and interdisciplinary. Indexes alternative, radical and left periodicals, newspapers and magazines. Provides alternative viewpoints on internationally significant subjects.

Contemporary Women 's Issues (Lexis Nexis)

Subset of selected resources covering current women's issues in Lexis Nexis ' *Academic Universe*.

Ethnic NewsWatch (Proquest)

Full-text collection of newspapers, magazines and journals.

Family and Society Studies Worldwide (Ebsco)

Core resource in a series of databases on family and gender related topics. Publications indexed in the database are drawn from a wide range of social science disciplines including anthropology, sociology, psychology, demography, health sciences, education, economics, law, history, and social work. Coverage is from 1970 to date.

GenderWatch

Full-text collection of international journals, magazines, newsletters, regional publications, special reports and conference proceedings.

LGBT LIFE (Ebsco)

Comprehensive coverage of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender Studies. This database indexes more than 120 core periodicals and has fulltext for the 50 major GLBT journals and newspapers. It includes a significant number of core books & reference works.

PsycInfo (Ebsco)

Recommended if you are looking for journal articles related to mental health issues for Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgendered clients.

Social Services Abstracts

Recommended for journal articles for research on social services and policy issues that impact the GLBT population.

Women 's Studies International (Ebsco)

Covers the core disciplines in Women's Studies including the latest scholarship in feminist research. This database supports curriculum development in the areas of sociology, history, political science & economy, public policy, international relations, arts & humanities, business and education. It's sources include: journals, newspapers, newsletters, bulletins, books, book chapters, proceedings, reports, theses, dissertations, NGO studies, Web sites & Web documents, and grey literature.

The Tretter Collection in Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender Studies houses over 30,000 items in a wide variety of media. The collection is international in scope and has materials in approximately 58 languages. It covers all time periods, from a 4,000-year-old phallic statuette from Egypt, up to current editions of GLBT periodicals. Although books are the core of the collection, substantial sections include textiles, glassware, film, music, art works, and three-dimensional objects such as event buttons and furniture.
