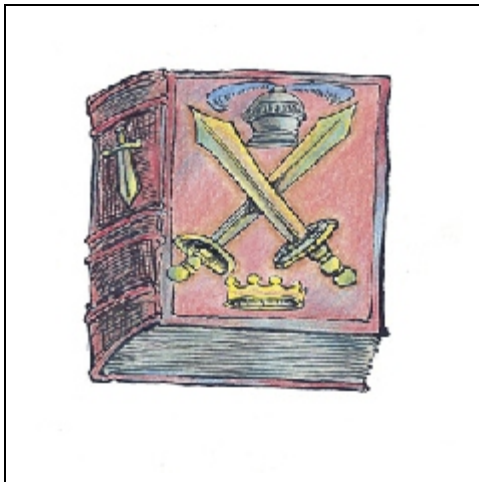

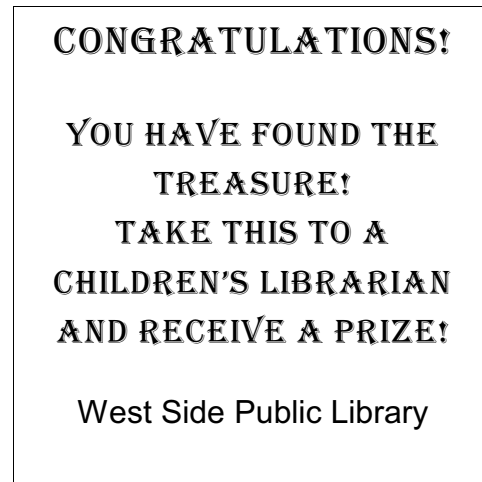
# Dragons, Dreams & Daring Deeds
